

The Khazarian Mafia has morally and intellectually crippled Ann Coulter

Ann Coulter is so deluded by the Neoconservative ideology that she cannot posit two consistent thoughts together.

As some indication of the moral and intellectual impoverishment of what passes for conservative in 2016, Ann Coulter has recently postulated in her new book that “Obama has turned our victory [the Iraq war] into a defeat and the birthplace of ISIS.”[1] Yes, says Coulter, the war in Iraq was a victory!

Coulter is so deluded by the Neoconservative ideology that she cannot posit two consistent thoughts together. She knows that the decision to invade Iraq, as historian Jean Edward Smith has recently argued, is “easily the worst foreign policy decision ever made by an American president.”[2]

Coulter knows that both Bush and Blair lied to the American people and the scholarly sources against her promiscuous statements are an embarrassment to riches.[3] The recent leaks this year shows incontrovertibly that the Iraq war was a farce.[4] Coulter knows that the war produced Abu Ghraib, which produced sodomy and sexual abuse of young boys.[5]

Coulter knows that the war largely destroyed Iraq.[6] She knows that even Tony Blair, one of the marionettes who beat the war drum in England for the Neocons, has apologized for the debacle.[7] Coulter knows that Bush even lamented that the invasion was his biggest mistake.[8] She knows that a number of Neocon shills such as Dinesh D’Souza, who perversely argued that Abu Ghraib “reflected the sexual immodesty of liberal America,”[9] have already abandoned the sinking ship. D’Souza said:

“The Iraq war, undertaken by George W. Bush, was a mistake. I supported the war at the time, because I believed the Bush administration’s claim that Iraq had ‘weapons of mass destruction’ (WMDs). In retrospect, that proved to be false. I don’t understand how a country can invade another country based on the suspicion that they have WMDs. We should not have gone unless we knew they had WMDs.”[10]

Well, Mr. D’Souza, would you tell Ann Coulter to just shut up? Can you ask her to stop annoying us all with her nonsense? Her incoherent statements are giving thinking people headache.

Even flaming Jewish Neocon Jonah Goldberg has declared that the Iraq war was “a worthy mistake,”[11] which means that it was a mistake nevertheless. In the same

vein, Francis Fukuyama, another flaming Neocon and noted academic, admitted that Bush made a serious blunder in Iraq.^[12] Coulter knows that the war sent a six-trillion dollar bill to the American people.^[13]

Yet instead of taking some responsibility, Coulter dumped the Iraq disaster on the Obama administration! Why? Well, Obama withdrew troops from the region. Coulter again failed to tell her readers that Bush himself signed a document which basically said that American troops ought to be withdrawn from Iraq by 2011!^[14]

You see, Coulter is not acting like a rational person at all. Her central point throughout the years is that if something goes wrong in America and much of the Middle East, the so-called “liberals” are largely responsible for it. In fact, if Democrats had any brains, Coulter declares, They’d be Republicans.^[15]

Coulter is just the type of person that the Khazarian Mafia loves and adores. Sounding like a bully, Coulter writes: “If we were 100 percent consistent with foreign policy, there are a lot of other countries we’d be invading besides Iraq.”^[16]

The Founding Fathers of America would have almost certainly told Coulter to stay home and shut her mouth for saying crazy things like that. She knows very well that her statement here is in total contrast to what the Founding Fathers envisioned.

Coulter would never tell her readers that George W. Bush supported terrorist cells such as the Mujahedeen, commonly known as the MEK.^[17]

Coulter’s recent diatribe is so full of nonsense and mumbo jumbo that one can write an entire book on the subject itself. She does make some good points here and there, but all those points get vitiated by her undying commitment to the Neoconservative ideology, which we all know by now is a Jewish political movement.^[18]

Let me focus on two other points. Throughout her book, Coulter keeps talking about Muslim terrorism, but she never once discusses the real cause of the issue, nor has she ever addressed the fact that at least 200 Israelis were arrested right after the 9/11 attack. 140 of those were detained by the FBI right before the 9/11 attack.

Many of those Israelis “had used cover stories to gain access to sensitive government buildings and the homes of American officials.”^[19] The Washington Post,^[20] the Telegraph,^[21] and other media outlets such as the widely read French newspaper Le Monde^[22] began to ask why many of those people were arrested. No one was able to answer the question because those Israelis were never prosecuted.

According to John Farmer, former senior counsel to the 9/11 Commission, the 9/11 Commission report is unreliable and many who wrote the report were misled.^[23] These issues prompted a number of physicists and academics—at least 75 of them—to postulate that more evidence was needed for the airplane hypothesis. One of them, Professor David Gabbard, declared, “We’re academics and we’re rational, and we really believe Congress or someone should investigate this.”^[24] According to Sylvain Cypel of Le Monde, there is no doubt that the Israelis—at least the Mossad—were

aware of the 9/11 attack before it happened.[25] At least Fox News got half of the story right this time:

The second issue that Coulter would never get the courage to address is the real people behind the immigration issue. Throughout her recent book and even her previous one, Coulter keep whining and crying about immigration, but she would never tell us the real culprits behind the curtain. Why? Obviously she would be classified as a vicious anti-Semite.

Consider the following title from the Jewish Daily Forward: “Jews Unite Behind Push for Immigration Reform”[26]; “The Jewish Face of the Immigration Reform Struggle”[27]; “Why the Supreme Court Immigration Decision Is a Jewish Issue”[28]; “Jewish Groups Push for Immigration Reform on Passover Eve.”[29]

You see, Coulter cannot address this issue in a coherent manner because that would ruin her entire ideological foundation. In fact, things got a little interesting last May when Coulter was asked about Jewish immigration to the United States. What was her response? “Oh God, not the Jews again.”[30]

That woman is scared to talk about the most taboo thing in America and much of the world because she remembered that her political career was almost over when she railed against Republicans for licking the boots of the Jewish oligarchs. “How many fucking Jews do these people think there are in the United States?” Ms. Coulter said. Well, she had to beg for mercy to get out of that statement.

*One last thing. Throughout *In Trump We Trust: E Pluribus Awesome!*, Coulter largely blames “liberals” for demonizing Trump and saying ridiculous things about him. To her credit, she does have an entire chapter criticizing the Republican Party, but that chapter again says nothing about the real culprits behind the Republican mask, namely, the Neoconservatives, who were the first people who could not sleep at night when Trump walked to the political stadium.[31] Thomas Sowell, the Neoconservative shill who always endorses Coulter’s books, called Trump “dangerous.”[32]*

Coulter says absolutely nothing to flaming Neocons like Bill Kristol and others. She only mentions Kristol in her book because Kristol did not think that Trump would have made it thus far. No serious critical thought about Kristol’s ideology at all. Nothing was said about Kristol’s father being proud of his Trotskyist affiliation.

Trump did actually call Kristol “a complete loser,” but Coulter could not tread on that path because that could lead to the demise of her political career. She mentions “Muslim terrorist” all the time in her book, but in her subterranean mind, people like Kristol are not worse than terrorists. It’s “democracy” and “freedom” to talk about “Muslim terrorism” in America and Europe, but it is a forbidden fruit to talk about Jewish terrorism and how Jewish ideologues and revolutionaries have radically changed the ideals upon which America was founded.

Lest you think that this is conspiracy theory, listen to scholars Stefan Halper and Jonathan Clarke in their 2004 study *America Alone: The Neo-Conservatives and the Global Order*, published by Cambridge University Press, right after the war in Iraq:

“By capturing the nature with their vision of permanent external wars, the neo-conservatives and their ideological bedfellows on the home front have cast a shadow over our entire domestic policy.”[33]

Halper and Clarke argue that this is in complete “contrast to the general cast of the American temperament as embodied in the Declaration of Independence.”[34]

So, can Coulter be trusted on important matters? No. Is she morally and intellectually sick? No doubt about it. Is there any redemption for her? Yes. She would have to renounce her Neoconservative allegiance and abide by the moral and political order. Will she do it?

Only time will tell. But that may be too late.
